Subject: Revised treatment guidelines for asymptomatic and mild symptomatic COVID positive persons home isolation/home Care and CCC

In partial modification of the Guidelines for management of Covid-19 -A point of care approach, version 4.0 (POC), April, 2021, Government of Karnataka, regarding treatment for COVID-19 positive cases and based on the revised treatment protocol recommendations of MoHFW-GOI and AIIMS-ICMR, the RGUHS clinical committee for COVID-19, has recommended the following guidelines for the treatment of asymptomatic and mild symptomatic COVID positive persons in home isolation/home care and in COVID care centres (CCC).

Note:

- All medications shall be taken under the prescription of treating physician/ medical officer only
- If fever is not controlled with a maximum dose of Tab. Paracetamol 650mg four times a day, consult the treating doctor who may consider advising other drugs like non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) (ex: Tab. Naproxen 250 mg twice a day).
- Systemic oral steroids are not indicated in mild disease. If symptoms
 persist beyond 7 days (persistent fever, worsening cough, etc.) consult
 the treating doctor for treatment with low dose oral steroids.
- Patients may perform warm water gargles or take steam inhalation twice a day

 - weight shall be applicable Paediatric dosages as per body weight shall be applicable
 - Hypertension all persons to continue their regular medications for the pre-existing comorbid conditions like Hypertension, Diabetes Mellitus, Hypothyroidism, etc.
- Remdesivir or a The decision to cadminister Remdesivir or any other investigational medical professional atherapy must be taken by a medical professional and administered only not attempt to prin a hospital setting. Do not attempt to procure or administer Remdesivir at home.
